

CAMP RULES

- This is a Christian Camp. The conduct of each camper should be in keeping with Christian camping.
- No personal pets are permitted during camps or retreats.
- No smoking is permitted on camp property.
- No alcoholic beverages, firearms, or gambling devices are permitted.
- Modest dress should be practiced at all times.
- Swimming will be permitted only during scheduled periods when lifeguards are on duty.
- Each camper is expected to attend religious services and participate in the recreational and educational programs.
- Shaving cream fights are prohibited. All other building defacing activities are also forbidden.
- The Camp Director and Sponsors are responsible for the enforcement of all policies and rules and the supervision of their groups at all times.
- Sponsors are responsible for the campers' care of equipment and buildings. Sponsors are also responsible to see that campers are not left unsupervised in the cabins at any time.
- Each Camp is responsible for any and all damages to the Camp property. The camp group is expected to leave the camp grounds and buildings clean before leaving.
- Signs, posters, decorations, etc. must not be affixed to any painted surface or interior walls without prior approval of camp manager.

VIOLATION OF CAMP POLICIES AND RULES MAY RESULT IN EXPULSION FROM THE CAMP WITH NO REFUND OF ANY FEES PAID

Texas State Health Department Regulations

- Beds are not to be moved from one dorm to another. Maximum number of beds per room is 24. Maximum Camp sleeping capacity is 624.
- A licensed medical person must accompany each camp week.
- All prescription and non-prescription medications must be kept in original containers and properly labeled. All prescription and non-prescription medications must be presented to the camp nurse upon arrival and check in at Pine Springs Baptist Camp. Medications will be stored and dispensed from the camp First-Aid Station by the camp nurse. Per TDSHS regulations, campers are not allowed to keep or self-administer any medication.

Child Protection Requirements

In order for any adult (anyone over 18 years of age) to attend a summer camp, the following three items must be presented upon arrival:

1. Certification of completion of the Child Protection Course

The training material, test, and certification to fulfill this requirement can all be found at www.pinespringsbaptistcamp.com

2. Proof of a criminal background check

This requirement is fulfilled simply by having each adult sign a form stating they have not been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor. An example of this form that you can use is on the following page.

3. Proof that the adult is not listed in the national database of registered sex offenders.
